

NO PARKING ORDINANCE

The Town Board of the Town of Long Lake, County of Washburn, State of Wisconsin ordains as follows:

Section 1: PURPOSE AND INTENT

The purpose of this ordinance is to provide for the control of the parking of vehicles and trailers in the Town of Long Lake at such places where, in the judgment of the Town Board, parking poses a hazard to traffic flow or public safety.

Section 2: AUTHORITY

This ordinance is adopted pursuant to the authority granted to Town Boards under Wisconsin Statutes 349.13.

Section 3: PARKING REGULATIONS

The Town Board may by resolution designate no parking areas on highways or roads within the Township's jurisdiction. Parking within such areas, when appropriately designated pursuant to Section 4 hereof, is prohibited. Temporary parking for purposes of loading or unloading or in receiving or discharging passengers or property while the vehicle is attended by a licensed operator is permissible, providing that provision is made by the vehicle operator to move the vehicle promptly in case of emergency or to avoid obstruction of traffic.

Section 4: SIGNS

Parking prohibitions adopted pursuant to this ordinance shall be effective only when the prohibited parking areas are clearly designated by the placement of signs advising of such prohibition. The prohibited parking area shall be between the outermost of such signs. Signs containing the term "No Parking" shall be sufficient compliance with this requirement.


Section 5: PENALTIES FOR ILLEGAL PARKING


Penalties for illegal parking shall be as provided by law. The Washburn County Sheriff's Department shall have authority to issue citations and collect forfeitures for violations of parking prohibitions.


Section 6: EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage by the Long Lake Town Board and publication as required by law.


